WILMINGTON, NORTH CAROLINA — Ethan and Catherine Bolyard

Join us in extending a warm welcome to Ethan Bolyard (along with his wife, Catherine, and their sons, Isaac, Noah, and Josiah) as Heritage OPC begins denominational support this month. In God's providence, a small group of believers desired to plant a church in Wilmington, North Carolina a couple years ago. By October 2017, Heritage was approved to be a mission work of the Presbytery of the Southeast and soon began meeting regularly in a local church's fellowship hall. This month the Presbytery plans to ordain and install Ethan as the organizing pastor. Ethan testifies to the congregation's commitment to the ordinary means of grace, zeal for the beauty of Reformed worship, faith in Jesus Christ, and love for one another. He requests prayer that the Lord would 1) help them purchase a church building in the area, 2) bless the upcoming sermon series on the gospel of Mark, and 3) cultivate an evangelistic heart among the people for the city of Wilmington.



PASADENA, CALIFORNIA — Matthew and Lois Cotta

Pastor Matt Cotta shares, "Most recently, it has become clear to our congregation that in the provision of God we are well-situated to reach out to the vast and growing Chinese community in this region. It is estimated that there are over 300,000 Mandarin speakers here, and exactly zero Confessionally Reformed and Presbyterian churches where they might hear the Gospel and worship in their own tongue. Among those who worship with us are several Mandarin-speaking brothers and sisters in Christ, and a couple of these brothers have seminary degrees. On Sunday, June 30, we held a brainstorming meeting to discuss this possible outreach endeavor. A good number from our congregation came, including those who speak Mandarin, and there was an evident zeal to pursue a plan to go out into the mission field at our doorstep. The timing could not be better. Even as persecution is on the rise in China, God has brought China to the San Gabriel Valley. Now we must bathe these plans and preparations in prayer. Please pray with us in this regard!"



MIFFLINTOWN, PENNSYLVANIA — Ron and Carol Beabout

Pastor Ron Beabout reports that the congregation of Grace and Truth OPC is beginning to plan for Mifflintown's "National Night Out" event to be held in the park next to their worship location on August 6. As they did at the community fair in May, they will have a display with a variety of information about the church, the OPC, and the Reformed faith. They also plan to serve free popcorn at the event.
