NEON, KENTUCKY — Jay and Andrea Bennett

Reflecting on the Lord's care for Neon Presbyterian Church, Pastor Jay Bennett recalls Isaiah 55: "For my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways, declares the Lord. For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways" (Is. 55: 8–9). This fall the church has received two new visitors from the community—a married couple currently taking the church's new members class. Neon Pres. continues to share the good news with its neighbors; Pastor Bennet reports: "We set up a book stand at two fall festivals, sharing the gospel and inviting community members to worship with us. On one occasion we spent about an hour discussing the doctrine of the Holy Trinity with a local Pentecostal pastor. He wasn't persuaded, but the truth was shared. We also continue to lead Bible studies with men from a local addiction recovery center every Thursday evening."
